

1 in 5 Americans doesn't have an emergency kit. Here's what you can shop for now, so you don't get caught off-guard when disaster strikes.

Bottled Water

- ▶ 1 gallon of water/person per day
- ▶ 3-day minimum supply
- ▶ Water has a long shelf life



Flashlight & Batteries

- ▶ Several flashlights
- ▶ Battery-powered lantern
- ▶ Extra batteries to last for 3 days

Emergency Food

- ▶ 3-day supply per person
- ▶ Non-perishable food
- ▶ Don't forget pets!
- ▶ Pack a can opener (or several, in case one breaks)



Generator

- ▶ Backup for lights, refrigerator, etc.
- ▶ Minimum 2,000 watts (so you can plug in a heater if needed)
- ▶ Do NOT run indoors!

Other Add-ons

- ▶ First Aid Kit + other medical supplies (i.e., prescriptions, masks, gloves, etc.)
- ▶ Changes of clothes
- ▶ Duct tape
